She published *The Anti Racist Teacher: Reading Instruction Workbook,* and *Textured Teaching: A Framework for Culturally Sustaining Practices* about curriculum & lesson development focused on social justice.

She is a Co-Founder of *#DisruptTexts* through which she encourages teachers to work toward an inclusive ELA curriculum. As Co-Founder and Academic Director at *Multicultural Classroom* she leads professional development for teachers and creates teaching materials with and for leading literacy organizations.


Lorena is also the Chair of NCTE's *Committee Against Racism and Bias in the Teaching of English*. She lives in Tampa, Florida.
